SUMMARY:

Receive a presentation from First 5 OC regarding the latest Child Care Landscape data and hear how Washington D.C and the city of Long Beach have implemented an online data systems that serves as a support for families to get connected expeditiously to child care and discuss potential for supporting Orange County's families.

DISCUSSION:

First 5 OC staff will share findings from a recent child care landscape analysis to highlight the unmet needs of families in Orange County and set the stage for exploring potential solutions. Guest speakers from the city of Long Beach and Washington, D.C. will present the centralized systems they have in place to improve the ability of families in their community to get child care. Speakers will share insights on implementation, data use, language access, reporting capabilities, budget and staffing considerations, and community engagement strategies. These presentations will provide participants with real-world examples of how other communities have addressed child care access and availability through centralized systems.

Following the presentations, participants will engage in small group discussions to reflect on Orange County's specific needs, which elements of the models could be adapted for Orange County, and the roles each partner might play in strengthening access to child care. The session will close with table facilitators sharing out learnings and potential next steps. There will also be a follow-up survey to capture feedback on key priorities, potential barriers, and opportunities for collaboration. This input will help shape recommendations for advancing a local child care access information system in Orange County.
